The drama of the poem is seamlessly captured by the music.

AIR EMERGES FROM THE HEART OF LIGHT

This uplifting and inspiring song is the result of a sincere, friendly collaboration between Latvia's favourite musicians Aišpurs and Kaupers. Using symbols like a cliff face, a stone, fire and a flag - Latvia and its people are depicted as persistent and strong in the face of adversity. Light, in turn, symbolizes the hope that even in dark moments the Latvian spirit will endure.

The entrance of the brass bands marks the bridge that crosses from weaving the world of light, to its opposite nature (Rebels' Potpourri) - unravelling, untying, transforming - a great way of getting rid of superfluous waste - to find "the golden thread".... that we see in part three.

Rūdolfs Blaumanis has given every schoolchild the ballad of Tālava's Horn Blower and the immortal line of "my people are my gold!" If we were to ask a contemporary hero-gatekeeper for a noble ideal to rise up to, today's gold, what would it be? According to Strazds, Ķirsis and Kaupers, it could sound something like this: "My gold is the simple things, my generation's places, my own journey with well-worn pathways – as long as we're mindfull of not driving our mothers crazy."
